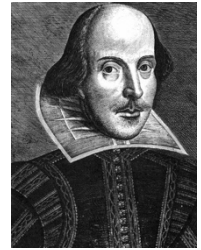


Shakespeare: The Invention of the Human/Perennial Questions

Final project ideas (approved)

A letter from your 80-year-old future self to your contemporary or current self about how to pursue and live a good life. With footnotes.



A letter to or from one of Shakespeare's characters instructing you as to how to live or pursue a good life. (The character doesn't necessarily have to get it right.) With footnotes.

A short film, a podcast series, a children's book, a curated playlist with accompanying essay.

A painting, ceramic work, cross-stitched object, or woodworking project, with accompanying essay explaining how the work expresses, celebrates, symbolizes the good life, or pursuing a good life.

A short play that dramatizes the fictional meeting of several of our key authors, in the style of *A Night in Miami* or *Picasso at the Lapin Agile*.

A life narrative as a graduate school/medical school applicant that puts into context the reason for graduate/medical school, how the experience will contribute to a good life, how the trajectory of your life naturally includes graduate/medical school and all that it represents.

A life plan (full instructions available from the professor).
